The tributaries and lands of the Chartiers Creek Drainage Basin have been mutilated by man in an effort to extract the mineral wealth of the Basin. This report deals with the acid mine drainage problems of the Basin. It is the result of an I8-month survey which began in April, 1968.

This survey shows that it is possible to substantially upgrade the stream quality and improve the natural drainage of the Basin through the remedial measures recommended. It has been the aim of this survey to provide permanent abatement where possible rather than resort to treatment. Total abatement of the acid mine drainage will probably require the construction of some treatment plants at a later date.

The abatement of the acid mine drainage in the Basin should result in both economic and environmental benefits to Allegheny and Washington Counties and is one of the many steps necessary for the Commonwealth to restore its drastically disturbed lands and reclaim its streams.
